## BE PREPARED

In an emergency situation, do you have what your household needs? Life is very unpredictable - the weather, earthquakes, floods, wildfires (natural or human caused), economy or political arena, workforce, health, any unforeseen emergencies - all factors that can change at any time, leaving a person without the ability to get to the things needed. Within this issue there will be a variety of information to help you become prepared.

You should start with stocking up on the basic needs, like a 72 hour kit. A list from Ready.gov can be found on page 12, from website <a href="https://www.ready.gov/sites/default/files/2021-02/ready\_checklist.pdf">https://www.ready.gov/sites/default/files/2021-02/ready\_checklist.pdf</a>. Also, depending on the emergency, the power could be out, so you should have items on hand that would provide light, warmth, and meal preparation, such as wood, generator, candles, lighters, matches, camp stove and fuel. Additionally, connecting to family and friends is very important to determine continued safety needs, and depending on the severity of the emergency, the cell towers will be non-functioning so your cell phone will be nothing more than a paperweight with a built-in flashlight until the battery dies, so you should have the equipment to communication such as a radio, power supply, antenna, laptop with winlink and/or putty. You are in luck, MARA Club is holding a "ham fest" on September 6, more information is on page 11; and trainings with the information is on page 6. Lastly, the Mat-Su Borough is holding an Emergency Expo on September 20, at the Menard Center in Wasilla and will include a variety of booths and raffle prizes opportunities. 




#### MARA Club in 2027

Open check in § 97.401 Operation during a disaster. A station in, or within 92.6 km (50 nautical miles) of, Alaska may transmit emissions J3E and R3E on the channel at 5.1675 MHz (assigned frequency 5.1689 MHz) for emergency communications. The channel must be shared with stations licensed in the Alaska-Private Fixed Service. The transmitter power must not exceed 150 W PEP. A station in, or within 92.6 km of, Alaska may transmit communications for tests and training drills necessary to ensure the establishment, operation, and maintenance of emergency communication systems.





V	Additional Rems to Consider Adding to an Emergency Supply Kit:
	Prescription medications and glasses
	Infant formula and diapers
	Pet food, water and supplies for your pet
	Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account records in a portable waterproof container
	Cash and change
	Emergency reference material such as a first aid book or information from www.ready.gov
	Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person. Consider additional bedding if you live in a cold-weather climate.
	Complete change of clothing including a long sleeved shirt, long pants and sturdy shoes. Consider additional clothing if you live in a cold-weather climate.
	Fire Extinguisher
	Matches in a waterproof container
	Feminine supplies, personal hygiene items and hand sanitizer
	Mess kits, Paper cups, plates and disposable utensils, paper towels
	Paper and pencil
	Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children







## Recommended Items to Include in a Basic Emergency Supply Kit:

	Water	and	non-perishable	food	for	several	days

Extra cell phone battery or charger

Battery-powered or hand crank radio that can receive NOAA Weather Radio tone alerts and extra batteries

Flashlight and extra batteries

First aid kit

Whistle to signal for help

Dust mask, to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place

Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation

Non-sparking wrench or pliers to turn off utilities

Can opener (if kit contains canned food)

Local maps

## FEMA's Ready Campaign

educates and empowers Americans to take some simple steps to prepare for and respond to potential emergencies, including those from natural hazards and man-made disasters. Ready asks individuals to do three key things: get an emergency supply kit, make a family emergency pian, and be informed about the different types of emergencies that could occur and appropriate responses. Everyone should have some basic supplies on hand in order to survive several days if an emergency occurs. This list of emergency supply kil items is only a starting point. It is important that individuals review this list and consider the unique needs of their family, including pets, for items to include. Individuals should also consider having at least two emergency supply kits, one full kit at home and smaller portable kits in their workplace, vehicle or other places they spend time.
